

The piece is an original choreography, especially made for the class to celebrate the culmination of their first year at WAAPA Dance. # Student notes (by Hannah Mitchell and Drew Holloway)

We named our piece using a combination of 2 words that occurred incidentally during the creative process: kaleidoscope and horizon. The group was inspired to generate various definitions for these 2 words and, put together, they capture the multifaceted characteristics of the learning we have undertaken as well as the piece we have created.

Our work embodies an undiscovered, constantly unfolding journey. We explore movement produced by many different but interrelated tasks, textures and atmospheres. Daisy invites us to notice and inhabit dynamic shifts, to energetically 'flip the room' at any given moment. We dance with an eclectic array of patterns, personalities and colours. These intertwine to create a textured realm of the known and unknown, as we move together, witness each other and search for an ever evolving present.
